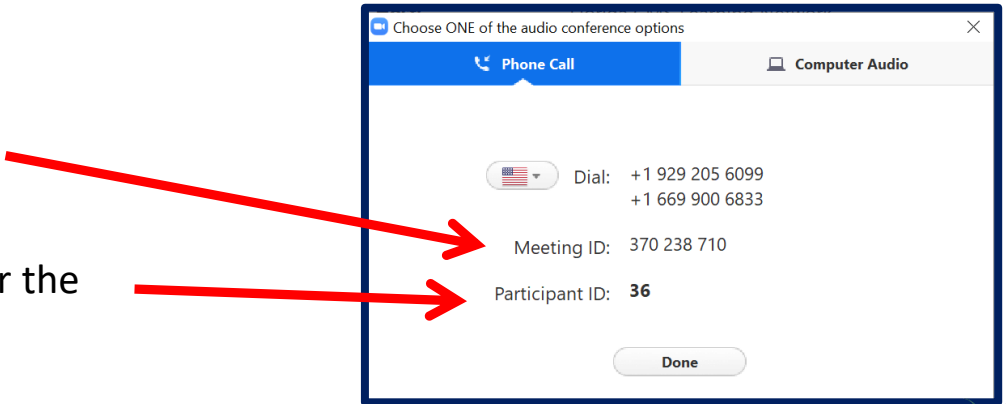
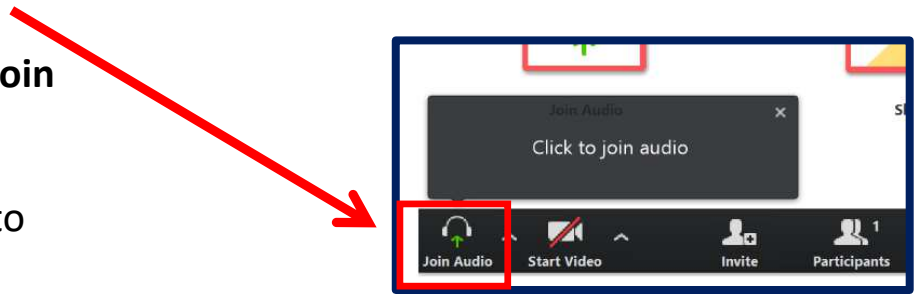

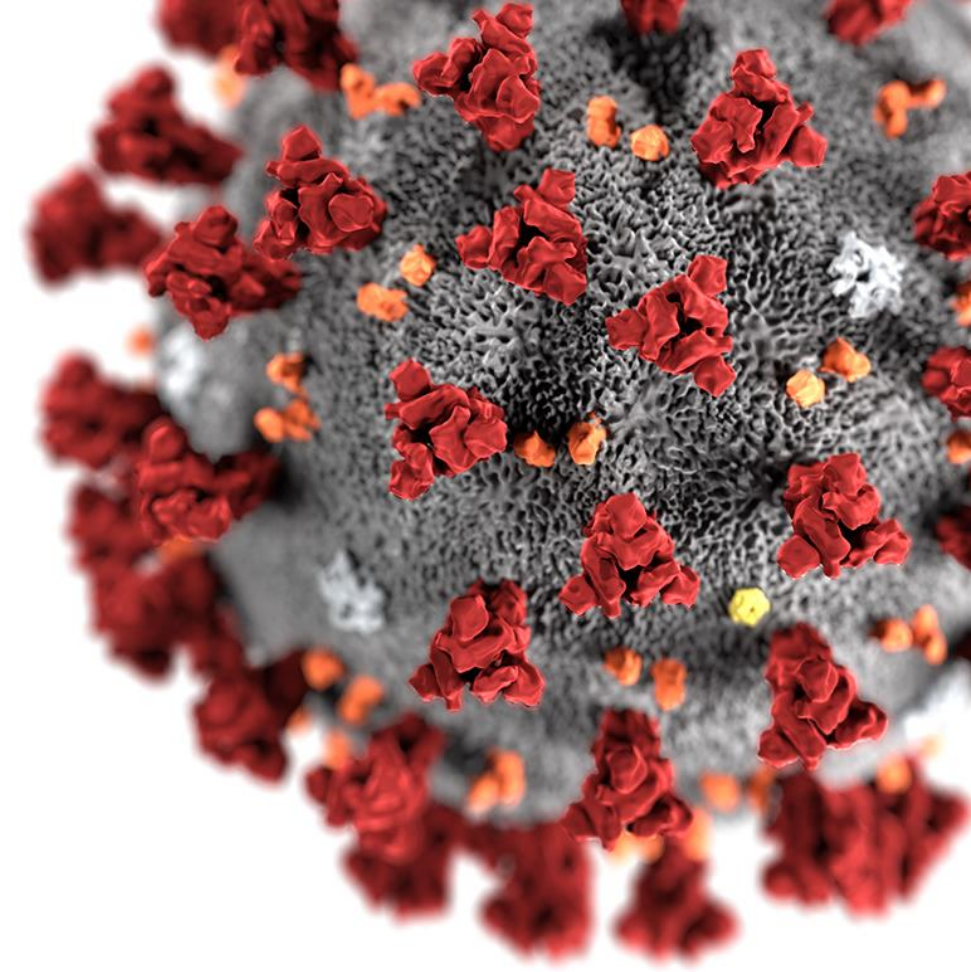

COVID-19 Response



Impact of COVID-19 on Maternal and Child Health

- Fear and risk of exposure to coronavirus
- Reduced access/utilization of well-child, perinatal, and well-woman care
- Altered labor & delivery care for pregnant women
- Altered systems of care for children and youth with special health care needs
- Loss of community supports
- Social isolation & increased mental health needs
- Increased socioeconomic stressors & family care needs
- Intimate partner violence
- Exacerbated health disparities (socioeconomic, racial/ethnic, rural, etc.)

Impacts across the life course that can affect generations to come



Healthy Start Programs' Response to COVID-19

- Adapting to telehealth and tele-education platforms
 - Virtual home visiting
 - Virtual education classes
 - Social media health communications
- Supporting frontline workers
- Piloting innovations
- Meeting emerging MCH population needs
 - Contact free supply drop offs

Healthy Start Initiative: Eliminating Disparities in Perinatal Health

- Support community-driven efforts to decrease infant mortality and eliminate racial disparities
 - 101 grantees in **34 states, D.C., and Puerto Rico**
 - Focus on communities with highest infant mortality rates
- Evolving to meet new needs:
 - Father/partner engagement
 - Reduce maternal mortality

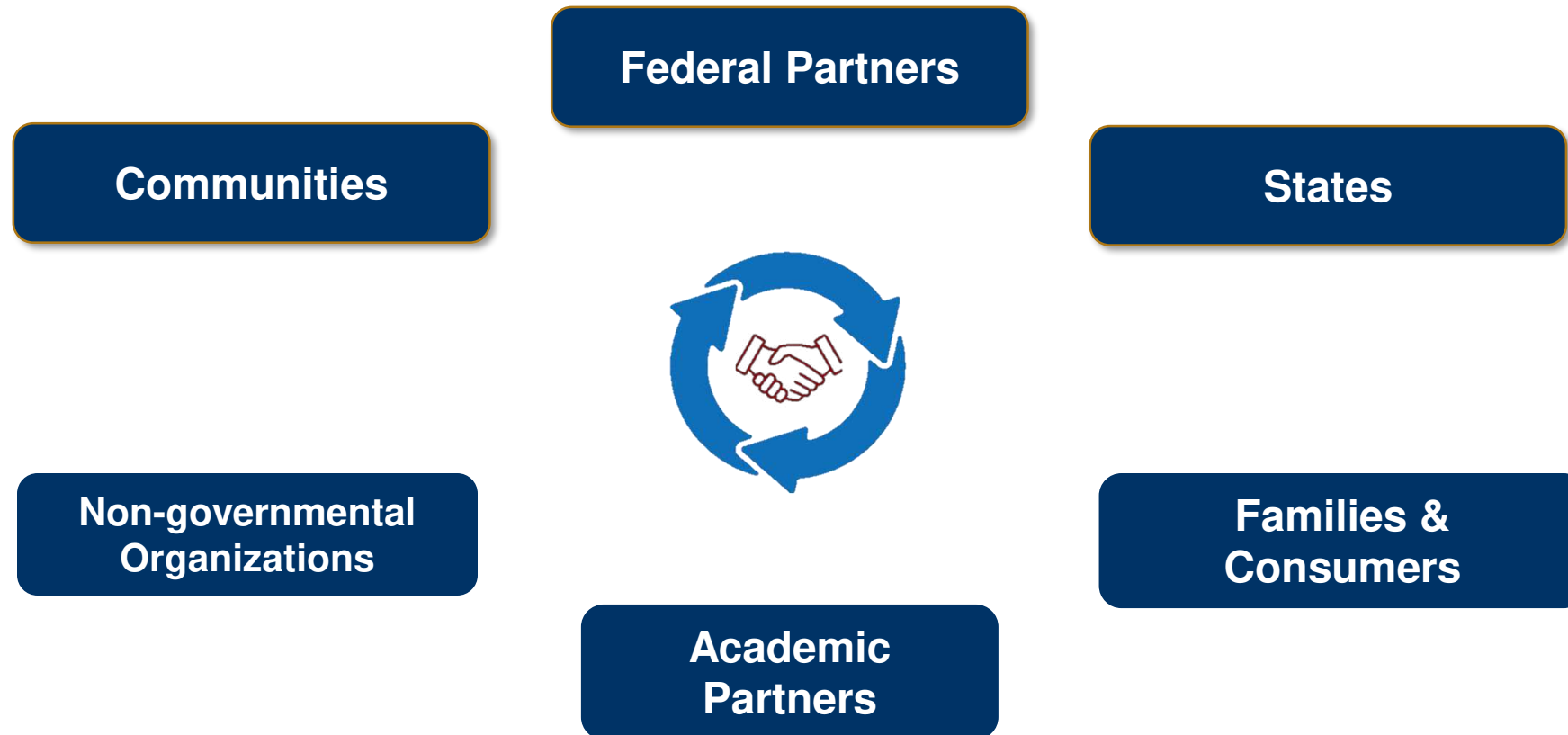
