
### **GAO** Evaluation

- A) Factors that contribute to infant mortality, including poor birth outcomes (such as low birthweight and preterm birth) and social determinants of health.
- (B) Communities with-
  - (i) high rates of infant mortality or poor perinatal outcomes; or
  - (ii) high rates of infant mortality or poor perinatal outcomes in specific subpopulations within the community.
- (C) The extent to which applicants for such grants facilitate-
  - (i) collaboration with the local community in the development of the project;
  - (ii) a community-based approach to the delivery of services;
  - (iii) a comprehensive approach to women's health care to improve perinatal outcomes; and
  - (iv) the use and collection of data demonstrating the effectiveness of such program in decreasing infant mortality rates and improving perinatal outcomes...
  - Other: addressing disparities



# What is the Maternal and Infant Health Mapping Tool?


- Interactive online tool for exploring the geographic relationships between maternal and infant health indicators, health resources, and demographics



## Vaccination: CDC Guidance




- Vaccination is our key to getting back to "normal"
- In August, the CDC <u>updated their guidance</u> to recommend COVID-19 vaccination for all people 12 years and older, including people who are pregnant, recently pregnant (including those who are lactating), trying to get pregnant now, or might become pregnant in the future

## **COVID Vaccines Hesitancy: What can you do?**

- COVID-19 vaccine hesitancy is multifaceted. The perceived threat of COVID-19, level of trust in public health agencies, and existing pre-COVID 19 vaccine attitudes play key roles shaping vaccine acceptance and confidence. Vaccination campaigns should be tailored to alleviate these specific concerns.
- Educate providers and encourage providers to advocate vaccinations for pregnant and women of childbearing age
- Utilize Community-based interventions (cultural competence), incentives, and technology-based health literacy for PSAs.
- Create a more positive client experience to make access to the vaccine easy and seamless, for example, have case mangers offer to escort the client to their appointment, and follow up through texts and or calls following administering the vaccine.
