Name one of the barriers that you face in your work with dads. 46 responses



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
Name a barrier that dads face when they try to connect with needed services. 27 responses





Many struggle with how to include fathers in their work with mothers and infants and the struggle gets deeper when it comes to integrating fathers into actual services?

It's important to understand the history of "exclusion" of fathers, Black & Brown fathers in particular, before we can achieve success in authentic father inclusion.

Past research demonstrates that we have all but rendered him invisible. And in the Age of Mass Incarceration, Black & Brown fathers are in a struggling to be seen; seen as valuable contributors, providers, and advocates for their families.

If we are truly going to achieve health equity for all in the future and keep Black & Brown mothers and infant alive, we must realize that they are stronger together.

Black fatherhood matters when it comes to addressing disparities in infant and maternal mortality. It's time to uplift Black Fatherhood because Black fatherhood matters.


