An Important Note from the Healthy Start TA Center

NICHQ is happy to be the award recipient of the Supporting Healthy Start Performance Project (SHSPP) cooperative agreement funded by MCHB's Division of Healthy Start and Perinatal Services, and is honored to serve as your new Healthy Start TA Center. We are also pleased to be in partnership with the National Healthy Start Association (NHSA) by providing them with a subcontract to provide technical assistance in the specific areas of fatherhood, mentoring, and Community Action Network (CAN) development, in addition to participation on the faculty planning committee for this project along with subject matters experts who will be under subcontract to support the identified TA needs of grantees. Apart from their role as NICHQ's Healthy Start TA Center subcontractor, NHSA will remain a membership organization and will continue to provide support to its members in many other ways outside of this project, such as holding their annual conference. While you may see some overlap in the TA topic areas, technical assistance that is offered by the NHSA under NICHQ's subcontract for the Healthy Start TA Center will be distinct, non-duplicative, and separate from the TA that is offered by NHSA as a membership organization.

NICHQ and MCHB want to be clear that Healthy Start grantees do not have to be members of NHSA to receive technical assistance from the Healthy Start TA Center, and that all TA provided by the TA Center is free and available to all **Healthy Start projects.**

Quick Update on TA Plans/Process: where are we in the process of providing TA?

The NICHQ Team continues in its phase of assessing the TA needs of grantees and has a specific request from you to support this process (described below). In addition, we will be sending out a needs assessment survey to all Project Directors to complete in the coming weeks. These results will assist the NICHQ Healthy Start TA Center in identifying the TA needs of Healthy Start projects and help us make any necessary improvements to our approach to meet your needs. We will be offering some initial opportunities for TA in the coming weeks, but

please note that trainings for grantees that are reflective of the needs identified in the assessments will be provided by the TA Center beginning in January 2020. In the meantime, please continue to make your TA requests by utilizing the Healthy Start EPIC Center and working with your MCHB Project Officer, and we will continue to respond to these requests.

Safe Sleep video quiz

How safe sleep savvy are you? This short video is a teaching tool for reducing infant sleep related deaths. It can be used to engage parents and caregivers in interactive conversations 1:1 or in group settings about safe sleep and breastfeeding recommendations, or shown in waiting rooms.

Infant Mortality CollN Prevention Toolkit

This interactive toolkit allows users to learn from participants in the national phase of the Collaborative Improvement and Innovation Network to Reduce Infant Mortality.
