



Doula program started in 2010 with contracted Community Doulas

Prenatal Doulas

SPHS Community Doulas work to educate and provide emotional, physical, and informational support to parents throughout pregnancy, labor and delivery, and the early postpartum stage.



Estrella Jail Initiative

- Doula -2015
 - In Maricopa County SPHS Doulas are the only support person allowed in delivery room to support before, during and after birth for Moms
- Case Management
 - All receive comprehensive risk screening, health assessment, and care planning services
 - Case management after birth to help Mom cope with loss of child, and works with Moms upon release
- Health Education
 - Childbirth Class-open to all pregnant women in Estrella Jail
 - Addresses Prenatal, Birth, Post Health Education


