

Breastfeeding is a Priority

Breastfeeding Promotion and Support is a Priority in Healthy Start

- 2 Healthy Start Benchmarks for Breastfeeding
- Ever Breastfed- goal is 82%
- Breastfeeding at 6 months- goal is 61%



IBCLC and CLC

There are several possible pathways to becoming an IBCLC (International Board Certified Lactation Consultant). Requires a number of college-level science courses and many hours of clinical practice in lactation prior to taking the exam. Often the candidate is already an MD, RN or RD.

The pathway to becoming a CLC (Certified Lactation Counselor) is more concise. Candidates are required to complete a 45-hour course and pass an exam. There are no specific educational requirements prior to taking the course.


Requirements

Each pathway requires 14 college level health science courses including medical terminology, psychology, anatomy and physiology.

In addition, clinical lactation hours are required and vary in amount depending on the pathway. Pathway 2 was the best choice for me considering I was enrolled in a lactation specific Bachelor's program.



Union Institute Bachelor's Lactation Program






Program Requirements

Through Pathway 2, I was required to have 300 hours of clinical lactation hours where I shadowed established lactation consultants in both the hospital and in home setting. I also learned by listening to phone lactation consultation.











Building Trust in At Risk Communities

Community Defined Evidence (CDE) "A set of practices that communities have used and found to yield positive results as determined by community consensus over time. These practices may or may not have been measured empirically (by a scientific process) but have reached a level of acceptance by the community

- California Reducing Disparities Project, 2012



CDE

"CDE includes world-view, contextual aspects and transactional processes that do not limit it to one manualized treatment but is usually made up of a set of practices that are culturally rooted-I supplemental approach "

Cultural Competence vs. Cultural Humility

Cultural Competence vs. Cultural Humility

- "None of us can truly become 'competent' in another culture. We can approach crosscultural situations with "cultural humility."
- Cultural humility is "a lifelong commitment to self evaluation and self-critique," to redress power imbalances and "develop and maintain mutually respectful and dynamic partnerships with communities." Tervalon and Murray-Garcia, 1998
