- "Many recall that 'crack babies,' or babies born to mothers who used crack cocaine while pregnant, were at one time written off by many as a lost generation It was later found that this was a gross exaggeration."

- As the U.S. Sentencing Commission concluded, "[t]he negative effects of prenatal cocaine exposure are significantly less severe than previously believed" and those negative effects "do not differ from the effects of prenatal exposure to other drugs, both legal and illegal."


TYPES OF CHARGES OFTEN USED IN HEALTHCARE SETTINGS

- Civil child abuse or child neglect
- Unconsented medical interventions
- Civil commitment/detention



POST STILLBIRTH OR MISCARRIAGE

- Approximately 25,000 stillbirths occur annually in the US.
- Miscarriages and stillbirths occur in 15-20% of pregnancies.
- Causes of stillbirth and miscarriage are unknown.
- There exists **no** affirmative scientific or medical proof that drug-use is the direct cause of a stillbirth or miscarriage
- Social determinants affect at least 50% of health outcomes.

Reports that end up being categorized as NOT abuse or neglect


Reports that end up being categorized as abuse OR neglect
