Publications and Workshop Presentations:

- A Father's Perspective: Issues Related to Grief and Loss Women and children have been the focus of much-needed attention around community health issues. But the intentional inclusion of Dad as an asset, (an obvious and necessary collaborator that he is) has somehow escaped our consideration. We developed a **Needs Assessment and Survey** to explore Fathers' perspectives as they relate to grief and loss because we needed to address the most overlooked and neglected portion of their experience.
- Adolescent Family Life Teen Fathers Program A professional development training to comprehensively examine the value of active fatherhood and its relationship to family strength and child development. Successful and proven strategies for recruiting, engaging, and retaining young men in a fatherhood program will be explored. We'll also look at child-centered, strength-based methods of developing and maintaining connections between moms and dads in or out of a love relationship.
- Get Connected / Stay Connected A booklet created to support incarcerated fathers and family men (who are in the care and custody of the Connecticut Department of Corrections) in their efforts to enhance their relationships with their children.
- Partnering with Fathers and Affirming the Roles of Family Men An Online Training Module for family support providers and home visitors, in partnership with Eastern Connecticut State University and CT Office of Early Childhood.



- The Value of a Man in the Life of a Child An eight-session program for family men to learn the unique value of their social, emotional, and physical makeup and its corresponding support to the development and success of their children at school.
- Paternal Prenatal Early Attachment A curriculum designed for expecting couples to strengthen fathers and enhance their support of mothers and children during pregnancy and after birth.
- Partnering with Family Men: Why and How? A day-long training to develop a working partnership between caregivers and staff that catalyzes social and emotional child development for children.
- **Parent Workshop Leadership Training** A ten-session training to inspire Parent Leaders to successfully implement parent-led workshops in partnership with schools.
- Civic Partnering Training A curriculum designed to support dual-capacity learning to be used by partner agencies and other interested organizations.
- Bridging Troubled Waters A professional development training to enhance the skills and competencies of family workers as they navigate the COVID-19 pandemic, social unrest, politics, and economic challenges. Navigating the space between themselves and the families they serve, family workers must understand the nuances of the impact of those issues. Our effectiveness depends on that understanding.
- **Intimacy** An interactive training conversation about the relationship between intimacy and selfcare, with strategies for deepening relationships personally and professionally.
- SEX: The Thrill & The Bill a workshop for older teens to explore a graphic examination of the benefits and costs of sexual activity as it relates to the social, emotional, physical, educational, and financial areas of life.
- The Benefits of Perinatal Father Involvement An article supporting father involvement with incarcerated expecting mothers.
- Co-Parenting for Your Kids to Succeed A booklet created to support incarcerated fathers and mothers (who are in the care and custody of the Connecticut Department of Corrections) in their efforts to co-parent so their children can succeed.
- **Relational Health Strategies** A professional development training that addresses the social, political, racial, and economic climate, complicated by the continued "hangover" of the COVID pandemic and its impact on collective and individual relational health.



- Nest Building Successful Parenting so Your Kids Can Thrive An Eight Session Workshop Series with a focus on family men. Parents will have an opportunity to discover ways to enhance their children's success while Co-parenting (whether they are in a love relationship or not) and to support their development.
- Fatherhood and Equity: Connection to Maternal & Infant Mortality A Three Session Workshop Series for family workers with a focus on fathers, how they show up, and what they bring to the pregnancy. Facilitators will learn how to work with fathers in that sacred space between them recognizing inequities, personal barriers, and institutional and social biases. They will discover how to help dads be at their personal best to partner with, support, and advocate for mom and their children during and after pregnancy.
- Fatherhood and Prevention: From Conception to Forever A Three-Hour Workshop Fathers are a social and emotional resource for Moms, children, and communities. Good fathering includes healthy relationships that enhance prevention. We will look back and start from early childhood to trace the preventive elements of fathering along with the skills and assets family men bring to the lives of children. We'll look forward, finding ways to address unconscious bias about family men while highlighting the value of fatherhood in your work. Together, we'll have a lively interactive conversation using a multi-sensual approach, with research, music, photos, and videos.
- Arise and Shine, We Have Work to Do A Three-Hour Workshop The colorless, odorless, tasteless, silent cloud of the pandemic and the stressor accompanying it are slowly lifting. It's time to re-discover ourselves and each other and connect. We will look back at our early childhood and learn the importance of bringing those experiences forward to weave them into our work with a fresh sense of enthusiasm and joy.
